

**The following points briefly outline the main activities proposed for the 2019 workplan, in order to have a preliminary discussion in December to guide a formal workplan proposal to be submitted by the network director and discussed by the lead stewards during the first quarter of 2019.**



Organize the second edition of the global event on open data day (March 3, 2019) with more than 6 participating countries, including activities such as #DataOnTheStreets.



Launching the public participation pilots project with IBP in 5 African countries, 2-3 Latin American country members and possibly one Asian country.



Systematizing the GIFT members commitments and country reports, with a supporting peer learning and cross-checking system.



Continuing the collaboration with the GPSA (World Bank) and other international financial institutions on linking public engagement with quality of public services, public investment and budget performance.



Publishing budget data using the OFDP components in at least 3 additional countries, piloting the tool in 2 more, and working on fiscal transparency portals in a new partner country (such as Slovenia or Croatia).



Organizing a conference on Revenue, tax transparency and public participation with the IBP and the World Bank.



Organizing a series of workshops on digital innovation in government, transparency and citizen empowerment with the Latin-American Development Bank (CAF).



Organizing a workshop on fiscal transparency and the environment with international financial institutions members, the such as the WBG and the OECD.



Having an external consultancy for developing a proposal of a sustainable business model for GIFT for the period 2020-22.
